How Manna Feeds the Need

Our Partners

Manna partners with hundreds of food donorsretailers, businesses, faith-based organizations, clubs, schools and hundreds of individuals to bring in the food our pantry needs.

Over 96% of the food distributed through our pantry is donated by the community.

Distribution

Manna is a local community food pantry serving the 101 corridor cities from the Conejo Grade to the Calabasas Grade.

Our "choice-model" food pantry enables clients to select the foods their family knows and will eat. Clients are allowed to visit the pantry every 14 days and will receive an average of 145 pounds of food, or 120 meals.

Programs

Community Food Pantry

A choice-model food pantry that allows clients to choose from a wide variety of pantry items rather than receive a pre-packaged bag or box. This method promotes not only a strong sense of dignity among clients, but is an effective distribution method because clients choose food items they know and like.

60-Days of Holiday

Purchased and collected holiday specific foods are made available to clients as an addition to their regular pantry visit from November 1st thru December 31st, so that every family in need can enjoy a holiday celebration of their choice.

Emergency Food Bags

Basic needs food bags filled with easy open, nonperishable food items are pre-bagged and made ready for quick distribution in emergency situations, such as evictions, loss of a job or flight from domestic violence.
